A joint letter from Mansfield Green E-ACT Academy and Birmingham City Council's Public Health Division

Dear parent or carer,

Alongside our colleagues at Birmingham City Council's Public Health Division, we would like to update you on the measures we are taking to keep your child as safe as possible at the academy.

Our close links with the Public Health Division mean that we get weekly and sometimes daily information about what is happening across the authority, and we would like to share this information with you.

An increase in cases across Birmingham

We know that whilst there is an increase of cases of COVID-19 in Birmingham, the virus is mainly spreading between family members and people who live in the same household or through wider social contacts. This means that pupils and staff are coming into contact with the virus in their daily lives outside the academy. Currently we have no evidence that the virus is spreading in our academy as we have been seeing mainly single cases or a group of cases in a household.

Furthermore, we have been reassured that our safety measures, which include regular and focussed cleaning of the academy, social distancing and ensuring good hand and respiratory hygiene at all times, are proving vital in helping to prevent the spread of infection.

Keeping our pupils safe

To reduce any impact of increased cases in the community, we are:

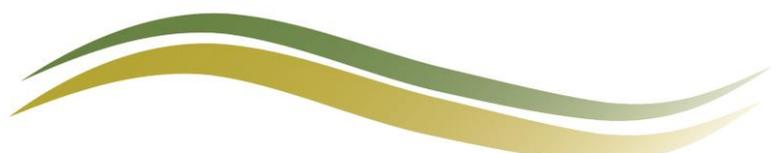
- Thoroughly cleaning the academy every day
- Keeping the pupils in 'bubbles' to reduce wider contacts within the academy
- Helping staff and pupils to socially distance - two metres where possible
- Making it possible for everyone to wash or sanitise their hands regularly
- Encouraging pupils to use tissues to 'catch it, bin it, kill it', if they sneeze or cough
- Making sure everyone wears a face covering when moving around buildings, if they can

We hope our safety measures will help to reassure you that we are doing all we can to make our academy as safe as possible for everyone.

An update from the academy

We have today been informed that a pupil has unfortunately tested positive for COVID-19, and is therefore self-isolating for a period of 10 days.

Public Health England (PHE) have advised that individuals who have been in close contact with the pupil must also self-isolate for 14 days as a precaution. Through the arrangement of pupils and staff





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into bubbles to limit contact between individuals, we are able to retrace their precise movements and identify and inform the individuals who must self-isolate.

For information, the pupil who has tested positive for the virus is in the **Year 4 Eagles** bubble and will therefore have had no contact with children outside of their classroom bubble or in other year groups. Year 4 Eagles must now self-isolate and will return to the academy on **Thursday 10th December 2020**.

PHE are satisfied that as robust safety measures are in place at the academy, we can remain open to all other pupils and staff.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID-19

Please be reassured that for most people, COVID-19 will be a mild illness.

However, because the virus can spread easily, your child must not come to the academy if they have a high temperature, a new continuous cough, a loss or change to their sense of taste or smell.

Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for a free test which can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119. We encourage symptomatic individuals to get tested at the earliest opportunity.

If your child is tested as positive, all household members, even if well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas and exercise should be taken within the home.

How can you help prevent COVID-19 from spreading?


We want to thank you for all the precautions you are already taking as it's making a big difference and is helping to stop the virus spreading. Please help your family, friends or people you work with to understand how important it is for them to do the following:

- Keep a safe distance from others
- Wash your hands regularly for 20 seconds
- Wear a face covering in enclosed spaces if you can
- No one in your household should leave home if any other person has symptoms
- If you have symptoms, stay at home and book a free test – visit nhs.co.uk or call 119
- Reduce the number of people you have contact with
