## **Transition**

We are approaching the time of year when we start to prepare for the next academic year. Change can cause anxiety for any child, especially for a child with SEND.

As a school, we will ensure that our SEND pupils are well prepared by giving them opportunities to meet their new teachers. We also give the children opportunities to spend time in their new classroom so that the environment is familiar to them. All relevant information is also shared with your child's new teacher so that they are well informed of the best way to work with the children.

We are a Silver UNICEF Rights Respecting School Children's rights are learned, understood and lived in this school.
